

A new housing development at the site of the former Crossways Methodist Church in partnership with Vale of Glamorgan Council and N J Hughes Construction Ltd was handed over in the autumn. This development offers 15 new homes for affordable rent, built to the highest energy efficiency rating EPC A to keep environmental impact low and energy bills affordable for residents in the long-term. The scheme received funding from the Welsh Government Social Housing Grant Programme to address the local housing needs in the area.

224 Youth Zone, South Bristol



In the summer it was great to see the progress of the 224 Youth Zone in South Bristol, being built on the land adjacent to Hartcliffe Way. 224 will open in Spring 2026, providing a dedicated, inclusive, and inspirational space for thousands of young people in South Bristol to feel safe, be themselves, and reach their full potential. Once finished, the state-of-the-art facility will provide thousands of young people with access to high quality youth work, sports, creative activities, skills development and wellbeing support, all under one roof. The site is being built with partners OnSide and Galliford Try, using £8.8m from the government's Youth Investment Fund, as well as contributions from Bristol City Council and St James' Place Charitable Foundation.















Ground breaking community-led development







We are delighted to be working in partnership with Brighter Places, Marshfield Community Land Trust Limited (MCLT) and Winsley White Building Contractors & Developers Ltd, on this rural exception site. The is made up of 10 social rent properties and 5 shared ownership homes. This scheme was led by a community initiative to deliver a small number of homes to meet an identified housing need. The homes are highly sustainable, using air source heat pumps to provide heating, and the affordable homes have been built to certified Passivhaus standards ensuring low energy bills for the future residents.



New homes in East Taphouse

Over the summer we saw the first aerial look at a development of 22 affordable homes in East Taphouse, Cornwall.

Working with our partners Coastline Housing and Sureflow Building Services to deliver high quality homes that make a real difference. We are looking forward to seeing these plans come to life over the coming months.

Former Royal Manor Arts College

Royal Manor Place project has delivered 41 new modular homes on the redevelopment of the former Royal Manor Arts College. Working with Magna to deliver 27 homes for rent, featuring one, two, three and four bedrooms, and 14 two and three-bedroom homes available to buy through shared ownership. Modules are constructed off-site by partners Rollalong in controlled environments, reducing waste and maximising material efficiency.

The project has benefited from a £4.6m grant from Homes England, which specified the use of modern methods of construction, and £410,000 from Dorset Council.

New homes for local residents

The Corsley Heath development, consists of eight properties. Five of these are designated for social rent, while the remaining three are available for shared ownership. These homes were constructed using modern methods of construction by contractor Rollalong. Site preparation, including groundworks, was carried out by principal contractor Fisher and Dean.


Inspiring the Next Generation - Class of 2025

In July Building Greater Exeter and its Partners hosted a successful week-long, hands-on learning experience for Year 10 students from Ted Wragg Trust schools, as they took part in the 2025 Construction Work Experience Week. The program, designed as part of the Building Greater Exeter Class of 2025 initiative, aimed to introduce students to the diverse career opportunities in construction and the built environment. Over the course of five days, students had the chance to rotate through a series of practical workshops, team-building activities, site tours, and career talks, all led by industry professionals and educators. During the week, students got to try their hand at a variety of construction skills, including bricklaying, plastering, carpentry, dry lining, and roofing, with sessions provided by New Roots Workshops and Vistry Group. These activities not only gave students valuable hands-on experience but also supported the national effort to address the construction skills shortage and "Get Britain Building." A highlight of the week was the communal bench project, which students worked on together. By Day 3, they had completed the bench, which will be donated by New Roots Academy to Wynstream Primary School. Building Greater Exeter will continue to deliver more construction-focused work experience weeks throughout each upcoming academic year, providing more young people across the region with meaningful insight into the
